To Participate in Lupus Studies

LUPUS • A chronic, inflammatory disease in which the body's immune system attacks healthy tissues and organs such as joints, kidneys, skin, central nervous system, heart, and lungs.

LUPUS • May occur up to 10 times more often in some American Indian tribes than in Caucasians.

LUPUS • Occurs 9 times more often in adult females than males.

LUPUS • Helpful therapies are available, HOWEVER THERE IS NO CURE!

Researchers in our Arthritis/Immunology Research Program have found **GENETIC EFFECTS** that seem to occur in families of various ethnicities. Participation of more **American Indian Families** is needed to identify the genes that reveal the causes of lupus.

To Participate:

- Families can live in the USA, Canada, Puerto Rico, or the Virgin Islands. (Travel to Oklahoma is **NOT** necessary.)
- Families must have at least **1 living member** diagnosed with **systemic lupus** (aka SLE).
- All participants will be asked to complete a questionnaire, sign a consent form and donate a blood sample.
- Nominal reimbursement available upon study completion.
